SAFETY METHOD STATEMENT

- 1. Daily and weekly checks must always be undertaken.
- 2. The van must always be driven responsibly and within all speed limits.
- 3. The exterior of the van must always be clean and the inside should be tidy and organised with all tools and equipment stored in a safe position, which will prevent movement during transport.
- 4. Any faults or accidents must be reported immediately.
- 5. If a driver feels too unwell to drive, they should not attempt to do so and phone the office immediately for further instruction.
